

Geo. F. Cope Dead

Pioneer Editor of Montanian is no more

George F. Cope, one of the really old timers of Montana, died Monday in Los Angeles, Cal., After an illness which had lasted for many months. Mr. Cope was one of the characters of early days and for more than a quarter of a century was prominent in the political and industrial affairs of Montana.

George F. Cope was born at Boonville Missouri, March 16th, 1842, and when he was a young man came west, first; locating in Colorado, where he remained for a while, following the occupation of a miner and engaging in other pursuits which engaged the westerners at that time. Tiring of the comparative inaction which characterized Colorado then, he came to Bannock, then one of the richest placer towns of the entire west and located in the ancient capital July 4, 1863. He was there in time to participate in the the great stampede when Bill Fairweather and his associates announced the wondrous discovery of Alder Gulch, but for some reason he did not and he remained at Bon Accord, as one of the settlements located below Bannock became known. There he remained for a few years and he prospered.

While residing in that section he was elected as a democrat to the 6th legislative assembly and he served with credit during the years of 1869 and 1870. Shortly after his term expired he came to Virginia City, making his home here. He had shown marked journalistic ability during the he was in the house and shortly after his arrival in Virginia City he was made editor of the Montanian, a journal which was merged into The Madisonian a few years later. The Montanian was the successor of the Virginia City Post, the first newspaper published in the territory of Montana and in this connection it will not be amiss to say that *The Madisonian* is the oldest paper to the state of Montana.

Mr. Cope, shortly after the merging of the two papers moved to Washington Bar, on Meadow creek, where he required valuable placer interest and these he developed for a number of years, later selling them to an English corporation. Since that time the placer mines have changed hands a number of times and the firm belief of all who have investigated their possibilities is that they will prove a source of untold wealth in the near future.

After disposing of the placer mines of Washington Bar Mr. Cope was elected clerk of the court of Madison county. In this position he served for four years and then went to Helena, where he was cashier of the First National Bank, leaving that institution some few months before failure overtook it during the panic year when so many financial institutions went to the wall all of the country.

While at Washington Bar Mr. Cope was married to Miss James, a daughter of the late Phil James and his wife and two daughters survive him. The entire family is well known in every part of Madison county and there is sincere sorrow over the news of his death, for Mr. Cope had many warm friends in almost every section of the state.

In politics Mr. Cope was always an enthusiastic democrat.

He was survived by his wife and 5 kids.
