### THE MONTANAN THANKSGIVING

A Cultural Moment

Here in Montana, Thanksgiving is celebrated with a distinctive flair that combines our rugged independence with a deep sense of community. Since Montana's statehood in 1889, our governors have followed the national trend, issuing annual proclamations that align with the presidential decree. They were just biding their time until Thanksgiving. There's also the influence of Sarah Josepha Hale, the "Godmother of Thanksgiving," who campaigned vigorously for Thanksgiving to become a national holiday. Hale's romanticized vision of a Thanksgiving meal included roast turkey, and her influential writings helped solidify the bird's status as the holiday's main course. So, blame it on the abundance of turkeys, their size, and a bit of 19th-century marketing genius.

For many Montanans, Thanksgiving is a time to not only reconnect with family and friends, share stories, and enjoy a hearty meal. It's a time that emphasizes gratitude for the land we love and the history that binds us. it's a cultural moment that emphasizes unity and gratitude. It's a time when we come together, not just to celebrate the harvest, but to honor the connections we share.

The essence of Thanksgiving lies in its ability to bring people together. So, as we gather around our tables this Thanksgiving, let us remember the historical roots of this holiday and the enduring values it represents. From the Pilgrims' first feast, Washington commemorating the constitution and Lincoln's proclamation of unity, Thanksgiving remains a testament to our collective spirit of gratitude and unity. It's a celebration of who we are, where we've been, and the bonds that hold us together. So, here's to another year of Thanksgiving, Montana style.
