

William Owsley



William Owsley (c. 1842 – March 20, 1919) was an American pioneer and politician, who was successful in mining, real estate and related ventures in early Butte, Montana. William Owsley was born in about 1842 in Andrew County, Missouri, to Bryan Young Owsley and Caroline Grissam. William Owsley was descended from the Owsley Family of Kentucky; his father was named for his great uncle, Bryan Young Owsley, a former United States Representative from Kentucky and first cousin to Governor William Owsley. William's father died in 1853, when William was ten or eleven years old.

At the early age of 18, William Owsley left his home near St. Joseph, Mo., in the year 1860, and joined an expedition headed for the gold fields of Idaho. Before reaching Silver Bow in 1864 "Big Bill" Owsley had already had a varied and remarkable series of experiences as an Indian fighter and adventurer. He was at Bannack and Virginia City and, in fact, attended almost every new excitement that happened during those strenuous days. The records of the pioneer association have identified his activities with those of a score of localities in the formative periods of Montana and almost every living member of the association can relate personal experiences where he was a prominent participant.

William Owsley moved to Montana in 1863, intending to make his fortune in mining. However, after working a placer claim for a year with a partner, the two parted ways with the partner taking the past year's proceeds and Owsley retaining the claim - which became Owsley's first property in what would become a successful livery and real estate career. Owsley was one of a handful of Butte pioneers who built their fortunes on commercial property rather than resource extraction.

November 1869 William married Miss Kate Van Ettin of New York. His wife died and some years afterward he married Miss Bertha Pease, daughter of Dr. Pease of Twin Bridges, a pioneer of the Madison valley. They had only one child, Merritt.

Beginning in the late 1880s, Owsley built several large brick commercial buildings in Butte that bore his name. The largest, completed in 1891 and named the Owsley Block, was a six-story brick building that was the first large business block constructed in Butte. This block was thought to be the finest structure in Montana and one of the finest in the West As of 2019, two Owsley buildings remain standing on East Park Street in the Butte-Anaconda Historic District.

On May 2, 1882, William Owsley, one of the city's most substantial residents, was elected as the fourth mayor of Butte, Montana. Owsley ran on a democratic ticket that was primarily focused on labor protection for white workers, and that promoted Chinese exclusion. He served two consecutive one-year terms, retiring from the mayor office in May of 1883.

Owsley later made large real estate and mining investments in Mud Lake, Idaho, and in Twin Bridges, Montana. In 1917 Mr. Owsley became identified with a Carey act irrigation project, near Hamer, Idaho. This became known as the Owsley project. With him in this enterprise were several Butte men. Later he acquired valuable farming lands in that section and lived there several years, returning to Montana in the Fall of 1919 and moving to his farm near Twin Bridges to spend the winter.

At the time of his death, he held the distinction of being the oldest living ex-mayor of Butte and it was during his term of office that the first city hall, which was found on West Broadway adjoining the Renshaw Hall. Owsley died on March 20, 1919, at his ranch in Twin Bridges at the age of 77.

One of Owsley old-time friends said, "Bill Owsley's word was as good as any man's

bond. What he said he would do, he invariable did. He was square in everything."



SHERIDAN LIBRARY RECEIVES PILCROW GRANT CHILDREN'S BOOKS

The Friends of the Sheridan Library has received 110 children's books through a grant from The Pilcrow Foundation.

The Pilcrow Foundation, named after the symbol (¶) used to mark a new paragraph, is a nationwide non-profit organization which donates new, quality, hardcover children's books to small, rural public libraries in the United States through its Books for Children program. The new books provided through the Children's Book Project have become part of the library's permanent children's book collection, thus ensuring children's access to quality books for years to come.

The books include a variety from Easy Readers to Middle School titles, and includes award winners, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) titles, as well as books related to children's health and wellness. They are currently available for checkout at the Sheridan Library or through the Four Rivers User Sharing Group, a network of rural libraries in Madison, Jefferson and Beaverhead Counties.

From the Pilcrow Foundation: "We recognize the importance of public libraries in rural communities. Libraries are often the center of the community, where people come together to learn and share ideas. We know that reading to and with children every day and providing them with frequent opportunities to read on their own are important activities for literacy development. 





These are free events but donations are greatly appreciated. The weather plays a big part in these events, overcast skies block out the stars as does rain & snow, also winds greater than 15 MPH moves the telescopes. In such an event we will have an astronomical presentation that you can understand. Dress warm as it does cool down with these starting times. If we have clear skies the public night will start with a laser tour of the night sky, pointing out the constellations and some astronomical objects. After the tour we start viewing objects with telescopes.

Directions to the observatory from Twin Bridges go 3 miles on Hwy 287 towards Sheridan. Turn left onto, Wet Georgia Road (gravel), there is a sign on the fence (Cottontail Observatory 3 miles), you will go through 3 cattle guards, after the third cattle guard take the road on the left. Go 1 mile, through another cattle guard and take a right, you a have arrived at

the Cottontail Observatory.






